

Japanese Experience Program in Kyoto (JEP Kyoto)

[JEP-E] Study Course, General Curriculum (Tentative)

Minimum Credit Registration Requirement: 16 Credits/Each Semester

Ryukoku University Credit Hours (Electives): 1.5 hours each X 15 weeks = 2 credits

Ryukoku University Credit Hours (Language Classes): 1.5 hours each X 15 weeks = 1 credit

Core Subjects (Compulsory Subjects)

(Subjects marked with [●] must be taken in both semesters. Subjects marked with [◆] are taken by first semester JEP-E students, and can only be registered for once. A subject title ending in [A] is held in Semester 1 (Spring Semester). A subject title ending in [B] is held in Semester 2 (Fall Semester).

Those who select [JEP-E] in the application process (and will stay for two semesters) will continue their studies in [JEP-E] in the second semester of their exchange period.
